Hello Families,

The state of Massachusetts has required that for the 2020-2021 school year, the influenza vaccine will be required for all students attending school.

The influenza vaccine is always important to receive in order to:

- Reduce the risk of getting sick with influenza
- Reduce the severity of disease if one does get sick (including the risk of hospitalization) due to influenza
- Prevent the spread of influenza to others

During the COVID-19 pandemic, influenza vaccine will be especially critical to help:

- Reduce the overall impact of respiratory illness on the population
- Protect vulnerable populations from severe illness
- Decrease the overall burden on the healthcare system

*The deadline for receiving the flu vaccine for the 2020-2021 school year has been extended until **February 28th**, **2021**.

When your child has received their influenza vaccination, please provide the documentation to your school nurse.
