Students receive instruction in human growth and development, Childhood nutrition, Social and Emotional Growth, Child Health and Safety, and Early Teaching and Learning. Observational experience begins in local schools and centers in the Level 2 year, and full year internships are part of the Level Three curriculum. 150 hours leads to MA state EEC licensure.
